## ITEM

- I. Public Comment  
Chris Culvert announced the MTC sponsored Bike to Work Day and that Petaluma was nominated as the Most Improved Bike Community in the nine Bay Area Counties. Agilent Technologies received a nomination for the Most Friendly Bike Commuters organization.

  - B. Comments on Draft Strategic Plan text

Ms. Wilford presented the revised version of Appendix 2h the Project Sponsor Reporting Letter to the TAC for final sign off to take to the Board on May 9, 2005.

Appendix 2h was approved unanimously.

Ms. Wilford reviewed the draft of the Staff Report for the Agenda Packet that deals with the issue of how the SCTA will prioritize projects for Strategic Plan.

Ms. Wilford handed out a new version of the Project Sponsor Information Sheet and pointed out that the highway section was changed to focus on construction for Steele Lane and Wilfred Avenue. In the other categories, a request has been made to try and move these projects out for a more balanced approach in the first five years.

In the local roads category the County agreed to move out the Airport project and the City of Santa Rosa indicated that they would look at Farmers Lane and what they could push out.

Ms. Wilford stated that a letter has been submitted to the SMART District asking them to detail the amount of revenues that will be needed for specific project phases in the first five years acknowledging the bonding capacity available to SMART and urging them to use the Measure M funds as a match to Proposition 116 funding for Sonoma County.

Ms. Wilford pointed out that she would be meeting with PFM next Tuesday to run through a variety of factors to come up with a scenario that maximizes what is available for SMART, identifies what we talked about in the other categories the first five years.

Ms. Wilford pointed out that the admin draft example of the cooperative funding agreement intentionally had a blank page for a section on labor and harmony, apprenticeship, and bidder responsibility requirements. County Counsel drafted the language on the recommendation of the Operating Engineers and is present today to speak to this item.

Ms. Bratton addressed the construction related provisions for the draft cooperative funding agreement.

After much discussion about the proposed construction related provisions for the draft cooperative funding agreement the overall consensus of the TAC is wait and monitor to determine if there are issues related to labor disharmony, or if we are not getting a lot of qualified bidders then revisit it in a couple of years.

### III. TPLUS Activities – **DISCUSSION/ACTION**

Ms. Spilman reported that MTC is working on a Transit Oriented Development plan for their Resolution 3434 corridors of which SMART is one. MTC is leveraging money that they have invested in 3434 for station area planning. MTC has met with the Planning Advisory Committee and planning directors along the corridor to try and get some ideas about station area plans. This is moving forward and is a pilot program. No decisions have to be made yet about what stations will be done for the pilot program. The assumption is that there will be at least one SMART station area plan done with funding by MTC.

Ms. Spilman also reported that the TPLUS committee met in March and agreed on a basic framework of the mission and vision, and the basic goals and objectives that are transit oriented.

Ms. Klein reported the Regional Bike Program list would be out in the next couple of weeks.

### IV. Update on Caltrans Projects – **DISCUSSION/ACTION**

Ms. Gause reported that Caltrans is still waiting on the biological opinion from USFWS for the Highway 116 / Stage Gulch project. It is anticipated that it will be

received in time and that the environmental document will be signed by the deadline of June 30, 2005.

A stakeholders meeting on the Cotati / Sebastopol project will be held on May 4, 2005.

Ms. Wilford reported that MTC approved the budget for Steele Lane. The Caltrans Cooperative Agreement will go to the Board for approval on May 9, 2005.

The draft environmental document for the Rohnert Park 101 project should be out mid summer, and the draft environmental document for Santa Rosa to Windsor should be out around September.

V. Other Business/Comments/Announcements  
A. Windsor Functional Classification Request

Ms. Wilford reviewed Town of Windsor's proposal to reclassify a couple of roads in Windsor from local residential to urban collectors for the TAC's approval before sign off. The proposal was approved.

Mr. Moshier reported on the current issues of the RTP for the Local Streets and Roads allocation.

Ms. Wilford announced that Ms. Spilman was promoted to Deputy Director Planning & Public Outreach.

Ms. Wilford announced that there would not be a TAC meeting held in May 2005.

VI. Adjourn – **ACTION**

The meeting adjourned at 3:12 p.m.
